## **Jason Webber**

Jason Webber, Lieutenant a Commander of Investigations and National White Collar Crime Center training instructor, has been a member of the Clarksburg Police Department for the past 21 years. In that capacity, he has devoted 16 years to the investigations of financial and computer-related crimes. He has an extensive background in white collar financial and cyber-related crimes where his investigations have led to both Federal and State prosecutions. Lieutenant Webber serves on a Federal Bureau of Investigations Cyber Crime Task Force and is an Internet Crimes Against Children agency representative. Lieutenant Webber has obtained the following certifications: Cyber Investigation – social media and technical skills, FBI Financial Crimes, FBI Instructor Development, Certified Economic Crime Forensic Examiner, SWAT level II and SWAT explosives and breaching.

Lieutenant Webber has assisted NW3C curriculum developers as a subject matter expert in the area of Intellectual Property Theft investigations. He has also participated as an instructor focused on online investigative techniques in over sixty Intellectual Property Theft training programs and seminars for law enforcement around the country during the past six years. On many occasions, Detective Webber has also provided "hands-on" assistance to Intellectual Property Theft enforcement task forces, especially in the area of detecting and investigating online sellers of counterfeit products.

In May 2019 Lt. Webber was the recipient of the U.S. Attorney's award relating to a skimmer case where FBI TFO Webber and Secret Service TFO Jeremy Thompson disrupted a high-tech multi-state skimmer group that victimized thousands of people and had an intended loss exceeding a million dollars. Lt. Webber's investigations have led to successful convictions in West Virginia State court and Federal court. In 2018 Lt. Webber attended NCFTA skimmer training in Pittsburgh Pennsylvania.
