## **DESCRIPTION:**

A critical component of training is assessing if students learned anything and to identify gaps in learning and instruction. The assessment of teaching and learning is critical if instructors want to improve instruction. When instructors assess learning in the classroom, they are trying to determine the quality of learning, gaps in learning and how to improve in those areas. Once they identify gaps in learning, they make changes and again assess those changes to determine if they have improved learning, what many in academia call “closing the loop.”
